Kentucky 4-H Age Policy 2024-2025 Program year

if a young person's date of birth is...

Jan 1 - Dec. 31, 2015, his/her 4-H age is 9
Jan 1 - Dec. 31, 2014, his/her 4-H age is 10
Jan 1 - Dec. 31, 2013, his/her 4-H age is 11
Jan 1 - Dec. 31, 2012, his/her 4-H age is 12
Jan 1 - Dec. 31, 2011, his/her 4-H age is 13
Jan 1 - Dec. 31, 2010, his/her 4-H age is 14
Jan 1 - Dec. 31, 2009, his/her 4-H age is 15
Jan 1 - Dec. 31, 2008, his/her 4-H age is 16
Jan 1 - Dec. 31, 2007, his/her 4-H age is 17
Jan 1 - Dec. 31, 2006, his/her 4-H age is 18



· Jan 1 - Dec. 31, 2005, his/her 4-H age is 19 and is no longer a 4-H member

Program Year: The "4-H Program Year" in Kentucky is September 1 through August 31. The 4-H Program Year is twelve months in duration and coincides exactly with the twelve months used for reporting enrollment numbers using the 4-H enrollment system of reporting. (The 4-H Program Year will include culminating "events" that occur after September 1, such as a few county fairs, the Shooting Sports State Competition, national 4-H judging and skillathon events, and National 4-H Congress.)

Upper end of age range: Kentucky 4-H Age is the young person's age on January 1 of the current program year. On January 1 of the current program year, a youth must be 18 years old or younger to participate in 4-H during that 4-H Program Year. When a youth is 19 years of age on or before January 1 of the current 4-H Program Year, that youth has completed his/her 4-H eligibility and may not participate in 4-H as a member during the current 4-H Program Year. They should be encouraged to serve as an adult volunteer.

a. For example, 4-H age for the 2023-2024 4-H program year is the young person's age on January 1, 2024. A youth who turns 19 years old before January 1, 2025 will be too old to participate in Kentucky 4-H Youth Programs during the 2024-2025 4-H Program Year of September 1, 2024 through August 31, 2025

b. If, however, a youth turns 19 years old on January 1, 2025 or after, that youth may still participate in 4-H since his/her 4-H Age (age on January 1 of the current 4-H Program Year) was 18.

Junior and Senior Divisions: Some 4-H events subdivide youth into Junior and Senior divisions. Junior members are ages 9 through 13. Senior members are ages 14 through 18. Ages are based on their "4-H age" on January 1 of the program year.

Grade: Participation in some educational events is based on grade rather than (or along with) age. Follow the specific requirements in those cases. For example, 4-H Camp is open to any youth who is nine years old by the time of 4-H Camp or entering the 4th grade the following school year. State 4-H Teen Conference is open to any youth who has completed the 8th grade. State 4-H Teen Summit is open to youth who are in the 7th or 8th grade at the time of the conference.





SHOOTING SPORTS 4-H MONTHLY CLUB MEETINGS:

All 4-H members participating in the Boyle, Lincoln and Mercer County 4-H Shooting Sports should also participate in monthly club meetings. We will be electing 4-H Club officers, conducting service projects in the community, participating in leadership development activities and other things.

STATE 4-H COMPETITION ELGIBILITY:

All 4-H members participating in the Kentucky State 4-H Shooting Sports Education contest must be enrolled and active in their county Shooting Sports Education Program by June 25, 2025 Anyone participating in a state level competition must have passed their 9th birthday as of January 1 of the current year. All age categories are based on the participants' age as of January 1st of current year. Age groups will be 9-11, 12-14 and 15-18. Cloverbuds are no longer allowed to participated in ANY 4-H Shooting Sports Activity including archery. In order to compete in 4-H Shooting Sports, youth must attend 50% if the scheduled practices in order to compete at State 4-H Competition that is held in September 2025.

OTHER 4-H COMPETITIONS:

Throughout the state there are Invitational 4-H Shooting Sports Competitions. 4-H Youth may participate in any of the competitions, your County Extension Agent for 4-H Youth Development can assist you with registration to the events. INTERESTED IN BECOMING A SHOOTING SPORTS VOLUNTEER?

State 4-H Sponsored Training session is provided in different shooting sports disciplines according to availability and interest. Certification is provided following passing of test in any one discipline. The objective is to help shooting sports leaders become qualified to teach junior and senior 4-Hers proper techniques and safety when using a firearm. KY. The disciplines offered: Shooting Sports Coordinator, .22 Rifle/Air Rifle, .22 Pistol/Air Pistol. Black Powder, Shotgun, Archery and Hunter Challenge. Interested adults will have to complete youth protection guidelines. For more information please contact your County Extension Agent for 4-H Youth Development. Dates to be announced, it is normally held in October and March each year.

YHEC— YOUTH HUNTER EDUCATION CHALLENGE

Pumpkin Apple Muffins

1¼ cups all-purpose flour 1¼ cups whole-wheat flour 1¼ teaspoons baking soda ½ teaspoon salt 1½ teaspoons ground cinnamon

1/2 teaspoon ground ginger 1/2 teaspoon ground nutmeg 11/4 cups honey 2 large eggs 1¹/₂ cups fresh pureed pumpkin ¹/₂ cup canola oil 2 cups Granny Smith apples, finely chopped

Preheat oven to 325 degrees F. In a large bowl, combine flours, baking soda, salt and spices. In a small bowl, combine honey, eggs, pumpkin and oil; stir into dry ingredients just until moistened. Fold in apples. Fill greased or paper lined muffin cups, two-thirds full. Bake for 25 to 30 minutes or until muffins test done. Cool for 10 minutes before removing from pan. Note: Can substitute two cups granulated sugar for honey, decrease baking soda by ¼ teaspoon and increase oven temperature to 350 degrees F.

Yield: 18 muffins

Nutritional Analysis: 200 calories, 7 g fat, 0.5 g saturated fat, 35 mg cholesterol, 160 mg sodium, 35 g carbohydrate, 2 g fiber, 20 g sugar, 3 g protein
